Advanced Learner Loan

Advanced Learner Loan

If you are resident in the UK and aged 19 or over at the start of your Level 3 or Level 4 course, you can apply for an **Advanced Learner Loan** to pay for the cost of the course.

You will not have to start paying back the loan until you are earning over £27,000 per year. We will advise you how to apply for the loan when you are offered a place on a course

If you are in receipt of an Advanced Learner Loan and experiencing financial hardship, you may also be eligible for a bursary to help pay for books, childcare, travel to college and materials.

Help and support

We have an excellent reputation for the additional support we give our students.

Learning Support

If you have a physical, mental health or sensory impairment and/or learning disability, please let us know so that we can make arrangements for you.

Counselling

Fees and funding

West Thames offers a range of fees and financial support for adults studying at our College.

Free Level 3 Courses for those aged 19+

If you are 19 or over and do not already have a level 3 qualification or higher, you can access a free Level 3 qualification.

If you already have a Level 3 qualification or higher, but you earn below the National Living Wage annually (£18,525* from April 2022) or are unemployed, you can also access these qualifications for free. This is regardless of any qualifications you already have.

* Wage threshold may vary in certain areas.



Advanced Learner Loan

You can apply for an Advanced Learner Loan to help with the costs of a course. Loan eligibility does not depend on your income and there are no credit checks. The Loan can pay for your course fee as well as a number of other courserelated expenses such as the cost of:

- Childcare
- Equipment
- Special kits
- Books
- Art supplies and photographic materials
- Travel and course trips
- Exam fees


If you successfully complete a higher education course while using the Advanced Learner Loan, Student Finance England will 'write off' any outstanding Loan balances you owe - this means you do not have to repay it.

Fees and funding

Discretionary Learner Support

Discretionary Learner Support (DLS) is a fund that allows us to provide financial support to students on a course funded through the ESFA with a specific financial hardship preventing them from taking part in learning. To be eligible for DLS, all of the following must apply:

- You are aged 19-23 on an FE course up to and including Level 3, or aged 24+ on an FE course up to and including Level 2, and
- You are in receipt of benefits, and You have a family income of not more than £28,000.



Loan Bursary

The Loan Bursary is designed to help students who receive the Advanced Learner Loan and need additional support. To be eligible, you must be aged 19+ and:

- Be studying on a course at Level 3 or higher, and
- Be in receipt of the Advanced Learner Loan or have had your Loan approved by the Student
- · Loans Company, and
- · Be in receipt of benefits**, and
- Have a family income of not more than £35,000.
- ** If on Universal Credit, your family income including UC must be less then £35,000.

Childcare

West Thames College has a purpose-built day nursery catering for children between the ages of 3 months to 4 years. If you want to enrol on a course, you may qualify for a subsidised nursery place for your child during the periods when you attend college although places are very limited. Level 3

OCN to Higher Education

For students who want to develop a career in Midwifery

Duration 1 year full time

Starts 12 September 2022

Day / time You will attend college 12 hours per week (across three days) during normal school hours and should plan for a roughly similar amount of independent study.

Fees £3384* Home fee

This course is eligible for an Advanced Learner Loan. There may be additional fees for materials and course kits. International students pay different fees.

What will I study? The key modules for this pathway are: Midwifery Studies, Psychology, Health Science and Sociology. You will learn study skills such as note taking, essay writing, reading and research, preparation for exams and oral assesment.

Next steps HND or degree programme at university. We have strong links with local universities and will help you apply to the course of your choice.

Entry requirements GCSE Maths and English at grade A*-C / 9-4. If you need to achieve either your GCSE Maths or English qualifications, you will be required to undertake an initial assessment to assess your suitability to sit the missing GCSE. If successful, you will be enrolled onto the Maths or English course when you are enrolled onto the Access course, and you will study this GCSE alongside your Access course.

If you are not quite ready for the Access course, we may recommend the Work and Study or GCSE English and Maths courses instead, as well as digital skills, before progressing to an Access course.

For students who want to develop a career in Nursing

Duration 1 year full time

Starts 12 September 2022

Day / time You will attend college 12 hours per week (across three days) during normal school hours and should plan for a roughly similar amount of independent study.

Fees £3384* Home fee

This course is eligible for an Advanced Learner Loan. There may be additional fees for materials and course kits. International students pay different fees.

What will I study? The key modules for this pathway are: Nursing Studies, Psychology, Health Science and Sociology. You will learn study skills such as note taking, essay writing, reading and research, preparation for exams and oral assesment.

Next steps HND or degree programme at university. We have strong links with local universities and will help you apply to the course of your choice.

Entry requirements GCSE Maths and English at grade A*-C / 9-4. If you need to achieve either your GCSE Maths or English qualifications, you will be required to undertake an initial assessment to assess your suitability to sit the missing GCSE. If successful, you will be enrolled onto the Maths or English course when you are enrolled onto the Access course, and you will study this GCSE alongside your Access course.

If you are not quite ready for the Access course, we may recommend the Work and Study or GCSE English and Maths courses instead as well as digital skills, before progressing to an Access course.

For students who want to develop a career in Radiography

Duration 1 year full time

Day / time You will attend college 12 hours per week (across three days) during normal school hours and should plan for a roughly similar amount of independent study.

This course is eligible for an Advanced Learner Loan. There may be additional fees for materials and course kits. International students pay different fees.

About this course The Access to Policing course offers adult returners a coherent, integrated and supported year of study through which they will gain the knowledge, awareness, skills and confidence necessary for successful undergraduate studying in the intended progression routes for this Diploma. The course aims to provide a balance of essential study skills with specialist subject knowledge to enable the students to be prepared for the academic and practical rigours of undergraduate study in HE Policing entry programmes. It must however be noted that the Access to HE Diploma does not provide guaranteed entry to UK Higher Education Institutions

Next steps This Access course has been designed for progression onto the Police Constable Degree Apprenticeship and related HE Policing entry degree programmes.

Please note: Degrees undertaken via a specific force will be subject to a successful application, vetting and offer

Entry requirements GCSE English and Maths* at grades A*-C / 9-4. *If you do not have your GCSE Maths at grades A*-C / 9-4, you will be required to work towards this course alongside the Access course.

Please note: You will be required to undertake an initial assessment to assess your suitability to sit GCSE maths. If successful, you will be enrolled onto this when you are enrolled onto the Access course, and you will study this GCSE alongside the Access course. You will not be enrolled onto the course until we have the outcome of your Maths initial assessment.

For those who want to develop a career in bookkeeping and accountancy

Duration 10 weeks

Starts September 2022 or January 2023

Mode of Delivery In class

Assessment External exam

What will I study? Introduction to bookkeeping, working within bookkeeping, bookkeeping and accounts, spreadsheet software.

Next steps This qualification will enable you to work at a junior role in an accounts office and/or progress to the Level 2 Foundation Certificate.

Entry requirements You should have basic literacy and numeracy skills.

Foundation Certificate in Bookkeeping

Level 2 AAT Foundation Certificate

For those who want to develop a career in bookkeeping and accountancy

Mode of Delivery Blended

Assessment External exam

What will I study? Processing bookkeeping transactions, control accounts, journals and the banking system.

Next steps This qualification will enable you to fulfil a wide range of functions in an accounts office and/or move on to further study in bookkeeping, accountancy or computerised accounts.

Entry requirements You should have achieved AAT Level 1 in Bookkeeping or equivalent or working in Accounting.

Certificate in Bookkeeping

Duration 10 weeks

Mode of Delivery In class

Assessment External exam

What will I study?

- Financial Accounting: Preparing Financial Statements
- Tax Processes for Businesses

You will also develop business communications and lifelong learning skills, applying what you learn on the course to the wider industry context.

Next steps Students completing the AAT Advanced Certificate in Bookkeeping may wish to go on and complete the full AAT Advanced Diploma in Accounting. If you do choose to continue your studies in this way, then your achievements in the Bookkeeping qualification are carried over to the longer Accounting qualification. If you successfully complete this qualification, you can apply for AAT associate bookkeeping membership (AATQB)

Entry requirements You must have a sound knowledge of bookkeeping principles to undertake the AAT Level 3 programme. Achievement of an AAT Level 2 Foundation Certificate in Bookkeeping is advantageous but not essential.

What will I study?

For those who want to develop skills and confidence in a range of creative design theories

Duration 2 days a week for 10 weeks

What will I study? This course will encourage you to be adventurous and open minded in exploring a wide range of materials and processes through a series of mini projects including;

- Observational studies
- · Life drawing
- Surface pattern and textiles
- Photography
- · Printmaking.

You will develop personal skills and confidence in a range of creative design theories linked to artists and designer investigations, through research investigations and a gallery or exhibition visit.

You will be given the opportunity to collaborate with your peers and develop personal presentation skills that you can use to showcase your artwork through digital portfolios, social media and blogs.

Next steps You may wish to progress to the full Level 2 Diploma in Art & Design upon successfully finishing this 2 unit introduction course.

Entry requirements None but you will be asked to take part in an interview to discuss your interest in the subject.

For those who want to develop a portfolio of skills in preparation for HE or employment. You will explore and investigate a range of art & design techniques and processes and be encouraged to take risks in your practical work, alongside developing theoretical and conceptual understanding

What will I study? You will complete a diagnostic investigation into visual language and creative practice, through a series of themed projects.

What will I study? Facials, makeup, manicure, pedicure, anatomy and physiology, depilatory waxing, tanning, lash and brow tinting, eyebrow shaping, stock display, reception and salon administration, with English language support.

Next steps Level 3 VTCT Diploma in Beauty Therapy or Beauty Therapy Treatments to become a fully qualified beauty therapist.

Entry requirements A good general education. A Level 1 qualification in beauty therapy is helpful but not essential. You will need a reference and be required to pass an English language assessment.

Beauty Specialist Techniques

An intensive evening course for those who want to change career

Fees You'll need to purchase your beauty kit, uniform and textbooks

What will I study? Facial treatments, skin care, lash and brow tinting and shaping, manicure and pedicure, waxing, tanning, related anatomy and physiology, professional conduct, reception, stock display and health and safety.

Next steps Level 3 Beauty Therapy Treatments to become a fully qualified beauty therapist.

Entry requirements A good general education with good written English. GCSE biology is an advantage. You must be highly motivated and able to practice your treatments at home (we recommend 4 hours home study per week).

Duration 1 year

Next steps Level 3 Beauty Therapy Treatments to become a fully qualified beauty therapist.

Entry requirements A good general education or 2 GCSEs at grades A*-C / 9-4, preferably including English language and a science subject, or successful completion of Foundation Level Beauty Therapy with functional skills in English.



Lash Extensions

Learn to provide eyelash extension treatments involving the use of single eyelashes

What will I study? Consultation techniques, attaching, maintaining and removing single lash systems, and providing aftercare advice.

Asian Bridal Makeup

Level 3 Award in Asian Bridal Makeup

For beginners or those already working in the industry who wish to offer specialised services

What will I study? Consultation techniques and how to select products to suit the client, blending, highlighting and shading, eye and lip application, use of colour, variation of wedding type and removal techniques. The course also covers basic health and safety and positioning.

Next steps You may wish to progress to courses in Asian bridal hair or mehndi.

Entry requirements None, but you need to be prepared to practise at home.

Intensive Beauty Therapy

For those employed in the industry who want to become fully qualified beauty therapists

Duration 1 year

What will I study? Electrical facial and body treatments, Indian head massage, body massage, hot stone massage, microdermabrasion, health and safety, client care and related anatomy. You may visit a major exhibition and take part in competitions.

Next steps Further your career as a beauty therapist and/or study part-time specialist courses.

Entry requirements Level 2 NVQ or VTCT qualification in Beauty Therapy. A good general education and good written English are essential. You must be highly motivated and able to practice your treatments at home (we recommend at least 6 hours per week home study).

For those who are interested in becoming self-employed or wish to run their own small business once they achieve their hair or beauty qualification

What will I study? The VTCT Level 2 Award in Preparing to Run a Hair & Beauty Business has been specially designed to enable you to gain the skills, knowledge and understanding required to be a successful beauty therapy or hairdressing entrepreneur, including an awareness of the benefits and risks involved in running your own business.

You will also gain an in-depth theoretical knowledge of the laws and regulations in your region which will impact on setting up and running a hair or beauty therapy business. The course will be offered as an option for you to study alongside your hair or beauty qualification during the summer term.

Next steps You may wish to progress to further management studies or to a Level 3 hair or beauty course

Entry requirements You are already enrolled on a Hair or Beauty course at West Thames College.





Next steps The skills and knowledge acquired can be used for career progression into the cycle maintenance and repair sector.

Entry requirements There are no formal entry requirements for this qualification and learners are not expected to have any prior knowledge or experience, however an interest in the subject area is advisable.



Teacher Training

Certificate in English Language Teaching to Adults (CELTA)

Level 5 University of Cambridge Certificate (CELTA)

CELTA is an internationally recognised initial teacher training qualification designed for those who wish to teach ESOL or EFL and includes teaching practice and observation. You will learn the principles of effective teaching and acquire practical skills for teaching English to adult learners

Duration 11 weeks part-time or 4 weeks intensive **Starts & Day/time** There are 4 courses in the year:

- September-December (11 weeks, BLENDED: online learning with face-to-face teaching practice Tuesdays & Thursdays 4.30pm-8pm).
- January-March (11 weeks, **Blended:** online learning with face-to-face teaching practice Tuesdays & Thursdays 4.30pm-8pm).
- April-June (11 weeks part-time, **Classroom** learning Tuesdays & Thursdays 9.30am-1pm).
- **Summer Intensive** in July (4 weeks summer intensive, **Classroom** learning, Monday to Friday 9am -4.30pm)

Fees £1360*

What will I study? You will develop familiarity with the principles of effective teaching, language analysis and awareness, planning and resources, language skills, methodology, teaching skills and professionalism and acquire practical skills for teaching English to adult learners. The course includes the learning theory (online for blended courses), teaching practice, observation of experienced teachers in the classroom and completion of a range of practically focused written assignments.

Next steps After completing the training programme, you can develop a career in teaching English language to adults either in the UK or overseas. To gain fully qualified teacher status in the post-16 sector in the UK, you could progress to the Certificate in Education/PGCE (DTLLS).

Entry requirements Two A Levels and five GCSEs or equivalent. You also need to have a very good command of written and spoken English. No previous teaching experience is necessary.

Diploma in Education and Training (DET) / Professional Graduate Certificate of Education (ProfGCE)

Level 5 or Level 6 Level 5 Diploma (DET) or Level 6 Certificate of Education (ProfGCE)

This 2-year part-time university course is offered in partnership with Canterbury Christ Church University. It leads to the Diploma in Education and Training (DET Level 5) or Professional Graduate Certificate of Education (PGCE Level 6). Both qualifications are full, recognised teaching qualifications for the FE, adult and voluntary learning sectors

Duration 2 years part-time evening

Starts This is a two year course:

Year 1 September 2022 - June 2023

Year 2 September 2023 - June 2024

Day/time Tuesday/Thursday, one evening per week

Fees £3540 per year

What will I study? This course aims to develop the knowledge, skills and understanding of teachers and trainers working with students aged 14+ in colleges (FE), adult and community settings, prisons and probation service, secondary schools and private training providers. Specialist pathways are available for specialist teachers of ESOL, Maths and SEND. The course consists of 6 modules, 20 credits each, taken over 2 years.

Next steps Teach/train in a variety of settings in Further Education Colleges, Adult and Community Learning, 14-19 units in Schools and Academies and Private Training Organisations. Successful completion of this course will allow you to apply for Qualified Teacher, Learning and Skills (QTLS) status, which qualifies you to teach in FE and secondary schools.

Entry requirements A pass grade A*C/9-4 in GCSE English and Maths. We will also accept FS Level 2 Pass in English and Maths, IELTS 5.5 and other equivalent qualifications. We will assess your level of English before you start the course as you must be able to write at an academic degree level. A qualification in your subject area (minimum Level 3 for skills-based subjects or a degree for academic subjects). No previous teaching experience is necessary. A work placement is required.

Teacher Training

Award in Education and Training

Level 3 City & Guilds Award 6502

The Award in Education and Training is an introduction to teaching in the Further Adult and Community Education. No previous teaching or training experience is required

Duration 13 weeks

Starts There are 3 courses in the year, starting in September, January and April.

Classroom learning courses are one morning per week or **Blended** learning course - a small number of classroom sessions which will be held in the evenings.

Fees £441

What will I study? This course is designed to give you an insight into the roles, responsibilities and relationships in education and training; teaching and learning approaches; session planning skills; delivery of inclusive sessions which motivate learners; and using different assessment methods and record keeping.

Next steps You can start working as a teacher or trainer in post-16 education. You may wish to go on to the Diploma in Education and Training (DET/PGCE) in order to achieve a full teaching qualification. You will need to secure employment as a teacher to progress onto this course.

Entry requirements You should have a qualification or extensive experience in the subject you intend to teach, and A pass grade A*C/9-4 in GCSE English and Maths or equivalent. IT skills are desirable. Applicants who do not have GCSE English or Maths may be admitted to the course following initial assessment completed during the interview.

Supporting Teaching and Learning in Schools

Level 2 City & Guilds Certificate 5329

The Level 2 Certificate in Supporting Teaching and Learning combines theory with practical study. It has been designed to provide you with a good understanding of the knowledge and skills needed when working directly with children in a school environment such as how children develop their understanding, how to encourage learning and professional best practice

Duration 30 weeks

Starts September 2022 and November 2022; Parttime day, one morning per week and minimum 2 days working or volunteering in a school.

Fees £631

What will I study? The course contains nine mandatory units and a choice of two optional units. You will learn about child and young person development, safeguarding the welfare of children and young people, communication and professional relationships, equality, diversity and inclusion, supporting children and young people's positive behaviour, how to maintain and support relations with children and young people, supporting children and young people's happorting children and young people's happorting children and young people's nand how to help and improve your own and team practice in schools. The course is made up of taught lessons and tutoring, as well as observation in the work placement. 100% attendance is required.

Next steps You may be able to move onto a level 3 qualification such as Award in Education and Training or Level 3 Certificate in Supporting and Learning in Schools. If currently volunteering, you can look for full time employment, working as a qualified classroom assistant supporting the teacher and helping children in a school.


Entry requirements Students must be over 18 years old and have Level 1 Functional English or ESOL. There is an initial literacy assessment (Reading and Writing) prior to acceptance onto the course.

Earn as you learn

Apprenticeships are the ideal way to get hands-on experience whilst studying for a qualification at the same time.

- An apprenticeship typically involves spending four days a week in a work environment gaining practical skills and one day a week studying at college.
- You will receive a salary of approximately £200 per week, depending on the job you are doing and your employer.
- Apprenticeships take at least 12 months to complete – usually 12-15 months for Level 2 and 18-24 months for Level 3.

- **1** Decide which apprenticeship area you are interested in.
- 2 Register on the National Apprenticeship website www.gov.uk/apply-apprenticeship to see all the apprenticeship vacancies across the country.
- 3 Prepare your application make sure your CV is up to date.
- 4 Apply for positions go to the apprenticeship tab on our website or visit the National Apprenticeship Service.
- **5** Attend an interview if your application is successful.
- **6** Get the job! Start work and train at the same time.





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
